Interview Flow:

Section #1: Challenges

"What has changed about those 3 challenges over the last 5 to 10 years?"

"What do you think it would take to turn it around and fix those causes?"

"How have these challenges influenced your ability to do your job?"

"What sets an applicant apart during a college application process or job interview?"





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Section #2: Educators

"How has the parent, teen and educator dynamic changed in the last 10 years?" "What is the upside of those changes and what is the downside of those changes? "How much opportunity do you have to actually prepare your students with life skills in addition to academic skills?"

"If you had a clean slate for education, what does your dream curriculum look like? And what role do parents and teens play in that curriculum?"

Section #3: Employers

"What do you see as your biggest challenges getting the most out of young hires?" "What skills are important for a new hire to show up with?"
